

## CALL FOR TRAINERS (2 SENIOR / 1 JUNIOR)

<b>Title?</b>	“Youth work and European Citizenship: raising understanding and developing tools”

<b>Main topic?</b>	European Citizenship

### Idea, themes and objectives

All young people understand we are living in Europe, yet ‘Europe’ remains an abstract notion. The European Union and the Council of Europe aim to strengthen European citizenship, but what does that mean? Do youth workers have a responsibility here? This training course for youth workers will start from the beginning, with asking ourselves what could be understood by ‘Europe’, followed by exploring the idea of citizenship. We will take a look at the four aspects of citizenship: societal, cultural, political and economic factors. Then another core part of the training will start: developing and testing tools to promote active citizenship so they could be implemented in the local realities of the youth workers. The methods are as creative as possible, using non-formal education, for example brain storms, group work, role plays, energizers etc.

#### Aim:

- To raise understanding of the concepts of ‘Europe’ and ‘citizenship’ and to develop tools for youth workers on these themes.

#### Objectives:

- To analyze the different meanings of Europe (where, what, who)
- To gain knowledge on key concepts of citizenship: societal, cultural, political and economic factors.
- To discover the right attitudes towards the project of European unity (future of Europe)
- To develop and test new tools on European citizenship
- To promote active European citizenship, a common European identity and non-formal education.



### About JUB

JUB is a youth organization, founded in 2011, aiming to promote peace, understanding and co-operation between young people in the world. We aim to realize local and international youth activities, to promote

tolerance between young people from different cultures and countries. Further, we hope to encourage active involvement in society, without any distinction because of race, social status, educational level or any other 'disadvantage'. 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### Profile of the trainers

- Are willing to collaborate and work for the benefit of the project;

### Responsibilities of the trainers

- To have regular online meetings with other trainers and the project coordinator in order to plan the Training;
- To develop the latest version of the daily programme latest 2 weeks before the Training;
- To develop the relevant session outlines latest 2 weeks before the Training;
- To be present at the Training and implement their tasks in a collective way;
- To have a daily evaluation with the project coordinator during the Training;
- To prepare a final report which needs to be submitted to the project coordinator latest 3 weeks after the Training;
- Senior trainers need to provide support to junior trainer and work on them on development of their skills during the preparation and in the training providing them with relevant learning experience.
